

Student Expectations Guide

Having a comprehensive understanding of what is expected from you as an EdOptions Academy student is the key to success. Here is some important information you need to know about EdOptions Academy.

As a student, these are your responsibilities:

- Follow the [Student Code of Conduct](#). This information is emailed to all students upon registration in EdOptions Academy. You are responsible for reading the Student Code of Conduct and addressing questions as they arise. By enrolling in an EdOptions Academy course, you are agreeing to adhere to the Student Code of Conduct.
- Follow the information in the email your teacher will send you upon beginning each course you enroll in. This email will contain information specific to the course, which is crucial to your success in the class.
- Read the [Student Policy Handbook](#). This document details what you must do to successfully complete courses in EdOptions Academy.
- Stay on track with your assigned classes. Your teacher will help you monitor your pace in a class, but it is your responsibility to complete assignments on time and to the best of your abilities.
- Fall and spring session courses do not all run on the same schedule. Pay attention to the start and end dates of your classes. You are expected to spend approximately 50 minutes per day on each class, 5 days per week. *Please note that actual time spent on courses per day may vary per student.*
- Summer session classes can be anywhere from 2 to 8 weeks in length. Class content is not condensed; instead, the amount of class time each day is increased to accommodate the condensed timeframe. You are expected to study at least 4 hours per day, 5 days per week for an 8-week program.
- Regular contact with your teacher is one of the most important steps to success in EdOptions Academy courses. Teachers are available via email and phone, as well as through the collaboration tool built into your online learning platform.
- Stay in contact with your Site Coordinator and/or Coach if applicable. These are the people at your school who oversee the EdOptions Academy partnership. If you need to drop a class or need more time to complete a class, contact your school.

Other policies to note:

- No textbooks are required—all materials needed are online.
